WEATHER (Nov 17 – May 18).

“Winter will be colder than normal, with above normal precipitation. The coldest periods will be from late November into early December, from late December into early January, and in early February. Snowfall will be near to above, with the snowiest periods in late December and early in mid-February. April and May will be cooler and rainier than normal”. “**NOVEMBER, 2017:** Temp. 53 (DF = degrees Fahrenheit) (4 DF below avg.); precip, 3” (avg.). 1-2 Sunny, warm. 3-18 Rainy periods, cool. 19-26 Sunny; cool, then warm. 27-30 Rain, then misty, cold.”
