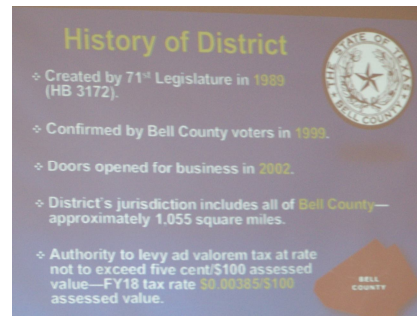

FYI: Water Education

River Authorities. “River authorities are “special law” districts that operate major reservoirs and sell untreated water on a wholesale basis. They may have responsibility for flood control, soil conservation, and protecting water quality. Many rivers authorities also generate hydroelectric power, provide retail water and wastewater services, and develop recreational facilities. River authorities often encompass entire river basins, reaching many countries.” Bell County is in the Brazos River Basin which stretches from New Mexico to the Gulf of Mexico. There are eleven reservoirs in the system.
