Harker Heights Kiwanis Club Meeting 08-21-18

Speaker: Mark Hyde

Topic: Water- Raw: All of Harker Heights water comes from Belton Lake. The city has 2 raw water contracts. WCID #1 for 5265 acre feet in Lake Belton until 12-31-2041 at a rate of \$27.30 an acre foot. The other is with the Brazos River Authority (BRA) for 3235 acre feet in Lake Belton and 300 AF in Stillhouse Lake until 8-31-2031 for \$74.00 and acre foot. The first is clearly the better deal. Overall costs for 2018 for 8800 acre feet will be \$405,324.50. In years with drought there are incentives to reduce raw water usage such as certain xeriscaping and hardscaping, tightening drought contingency plan parameters, changing current landscaping ordinances. **Treated Water** – WCID #1 from the Belton lake plant is 90 MGD (million gallons daily) and Stillhouse Lake Plant is 17 MGD. WCID #1 serves Belton, Nolanville, 439 Water Supply Corp, Harker Heights, Killeen, Ft Hood and Copperas Cove. A 2006 study for treated water projections came very close to the 2018 maximum highest day, July 29th of 10.46 MGD. The Belton Lake Treatment Plant's 2017 capacity was 16.25 MGD at a cost of only \$0.65 per 1000 gallons. Fines can be assessed for over use of water but as of now they have not issued any but do encourage residents to reduce their daily usage.
